Define AED program roles and responsibilities and assign people to those roles	<p align="center">What are "Industry Standards"?</p> <p><i>Industry standards</i> reflect common sense community expectations that guide how AED programs should be set up, managed and operated. Organizations that develop and follow common sense policies and practices, tailored to their unique situations, accomplish four important things including: 1) Responsibly meeting industry standards; 2) being reasonably prepared for SCA emergencies; 3) lowering the risk of bad outcomes; and 4)</p> <p align="center">How do AED Laws Relate to Industry Standards?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Industry standards apply to all AED programs in all states, regardless of the content of a state's AED laws. AED laws may influence but do not define industry standards. Compliance with AED laws is necessary but not sufficient for full industry standards compliance. 																																																							
Define AED response areas for each AED program site																																																								
Set a reasonable AED response time goal for each AED response area of each AED program site																																																								
Select AED placement locations in each AED response area that allow response time goals to be met																																																								
Place AED equipment, accessories and supplies at each AED placement location																																																								
Develop and follow a phased AED deployment plan if all needed AEDs will be placed over time																																																								
Put in place reasonable AED storage, security and access policies and practices																																																								
Put in place an AED equipment inspection, maintenance and replacement policies and practices																																																								
Adopt and implement reasonable AED use and response team policies and practices																																																								
Communicate information about your AED program to those who have a potential role in the program
